The goal of the DITEP course is to enable the **secondary educational professional** to recognize the signs and symptoms of drug and alcohol impairment in order to prevent an impaired student from driving away from campus, and to serve as a treatment intervention tool to reduce future instances of DWI.

Upon completion of this course, participants will be able to describe the involvement of drugs in schools and society; list the seven drug categories and recognize the outward signs and symptoms of impairment associated with each; describe drug trends in society including prescription drug abuse, Spice, bath salts, and energy drinks; identify the key factors that should be considered when discussing substance abuse with a parent; and properly document observations. There will also be a review and discussion of school policy based on elements of the Texas Education Code.
